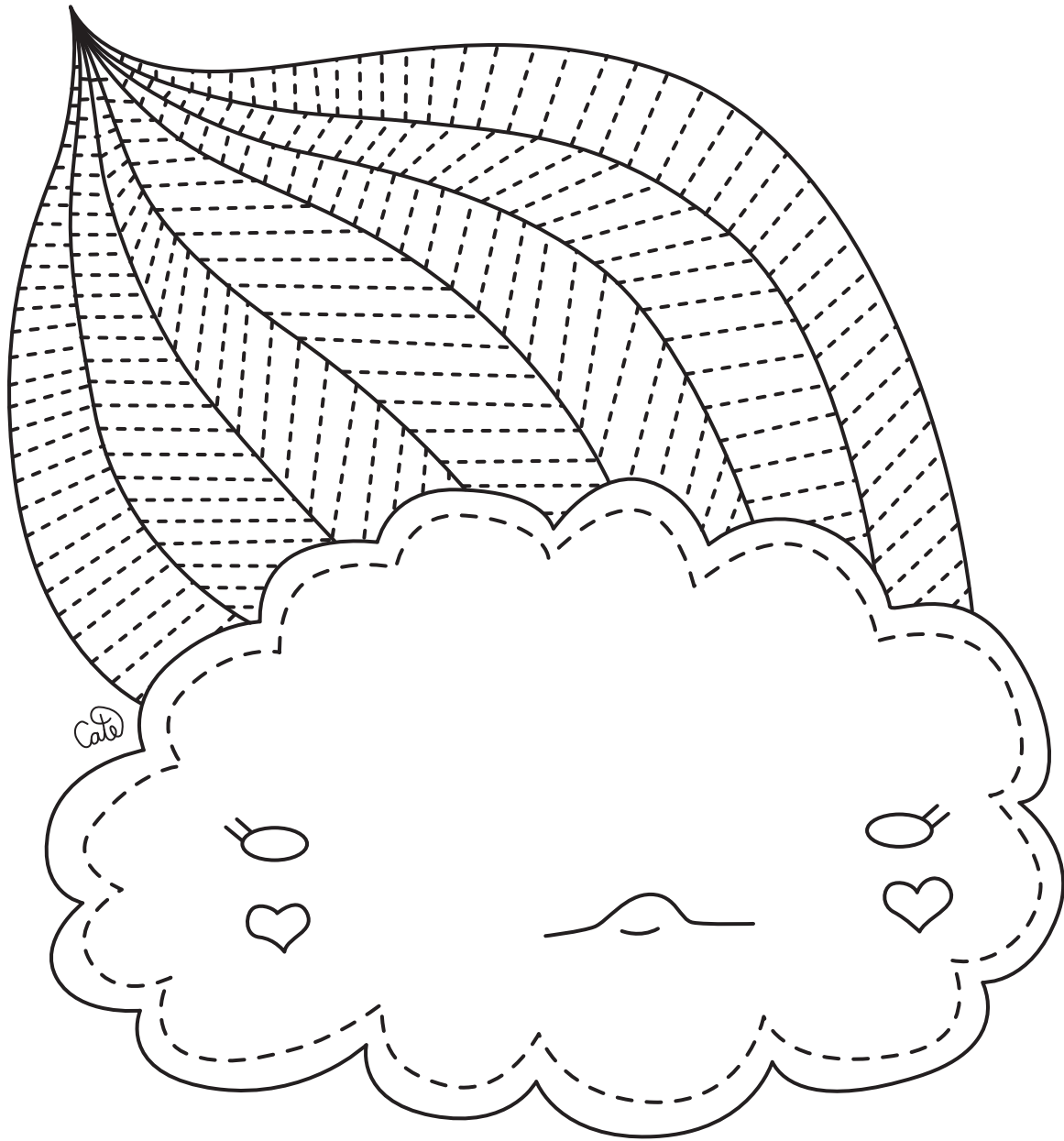

My Favorite Image Transfer Method:

1. Copy or print the design at the desired size. Make sure there's nothing on the backside of the paper you use.
2. Tape the design to a sunny window. (An aquarium actually works quite well for this as well, provided there is no angry little turtle living in the tank who is bound and determined to splash water all over your work.)
3. Position your fabric of choice in place so that the design is underneath the spot you wish to embroider.
4. Tape the fabric in place.
5. Use a washout marker (available in the embroidery section of your local craft store) to trace the image onto the fabric.
6. Have fun embroidering!

You may also transfer your design with:

1. Carbon paper placed in between your design and your fabric. Trace over the image with a pencil, and your design will transfer to the fabric.
2. Transfer pencils. Print out a mirror image of the design. Trace over this with the transfer pencil. Use an iron to transfer the image to your fabric.
